PREFACE.

In comparing the census of this volume of the Herd Book with Volume IV., a further increase in the number of the tame cattle is shown; while the wild herds maintain their strength—their census recording 92 head, against 94 in the last Volume.

The registrations in this volume number 182, namely, 36 bulls, and 146 cows, whereas in Volume IV. they numbered 168, con-

sisting of 39 bulls and 129 cows.

Besides the entire Kelmarsh herd, numbering 39 head, there are 45 transfers recorded in this volume. In Volume IV. 50 transfers were recorded.

The number of herds remains unchanged.

Two new herds have been formed: the Ampthill herd, owned by Mr. A. H. Wingfield, and the Horstead herd, the property of Sir Roderick Wigan, Bart.; while there is another herd in process of formation in the possession of Mr. J. T. Gowing.

On account of the lamented death of Mrs. Richard Gurney, one of the original members of the Society, the Northrepps herd has been discontinued and the Somerford herd, owned by Colonel Sir Walter Shakerley, Bart., was dispersed, at the sale on 7th October, 1925. The cattle in Mr. H. P. Wood's Hautbois herd were sold soon after the herd was registered. Fortunately most of the cattle from these three herds were acquired by other members of the Society.

At Shows there has been a satisfactory number of entries and a list of the principal prize-winners will be found on page 72. It is pleasing to be able to mention that more classes for Park Cattle are being arranged: besides the R.A.S.E., the Royal Welsh, the Royal Norfolk, and the Essex Agricultural Society's Shows are providing classes for Park Cattle in 1927.

It is most gratifying to find the excellent milking qualities of Park Cattle are much in evidence when official milk-recording is practised. On page 73 of this volume is a complete list (for assistance in compiling this I am indebted to Mr. Bohrmann) of the Park Cattle entries in the Ministry of Agriculture's "Register of Dairy Cattle" (to Vol. 9). In proportion to the total number of Park cows being milk-recorded the percentage of such entries is high, and it is pleasing to find a Park bull (Winkhurst Taurus 211 I.F.S.) among the only 25 bulls of all breeds in Vol. 9, Sec. II. (a): the latest published milk-records of this bull's dam and sire's dam averaged 11,630 lbs., and it must be added that their milk's butterfat-content averages over 4.7%.

Notes on the Numbers, etc., of the Herds.

WILD HERDS.

THE CADZOW HERD.

Owner: The Duke of Hamilton, Hamilton Palace, Lanarkshire.

The census of this herd amounts to 25 head, namely 4 bulls, 14 cows, 5 heifers and 2 calves; in Volume IV. it contained 24 head.

THE CHILLINGHAM HERD.

Owner: The Earl of Tankerville, Chillingham Castle, Belford, Northumberland.

There are now 43 cattle in this herd. This shows a decrease of 10 compared with Volume IV.

THE VAYNOL HERD.

Owner: Sir Michael Duff, Bart., Vaynol Park, Bangor, N. Wales.

A further increase is to be recorded in this herd; it now consists of 24 head, compared with 17 head in Volume IV., namely, 2 aged bulls, 1 two-year-old, 2 yearlings, 14 cows and heifers, and 5 calves.

HORNED HERDS.

THE CHARTLEY HERD (at Woburn).

Owner: The Duke of Bedford, K.G., Woburn Abbey, Bletchley. The progress in numbers continues; in Volume IV., the total was 40, namely 7 bulls, 26 cows and 7 heifers, whereas the present computation contains 13 bulls and 35 cows and heifers, showing a further increase of 8.

THE DYNEVOR HERD.

Owner: The Lord Dynevor, Dynevor Castle, Llandilo, S. Wales. This herd at present contains 3 bulls, 1 bull calf, 33 cows and heifers, and 10 heifer calves, making a total of 47, whereas in Volume IV. it numbered 49.

THE FAYGATE HERD.

Owner: Sir Claud Alexander, Bart., Faygate Wood, Sussex. This section now contains 1 cow and 2 heifers.

THE HIGHAM HERD.

Owner: Mrs. R. L. Jobling, Higham Dykes, Newcastle-on-Tyne. The census of this section consists of 1 young bull, 1 bull calf, 4 cows and a heifer calf.

THE POYNETTS HERD.

Owner: Alfred H. Cocks, Poynetts, Skirmett, near Henley-on-Thames.

There is a small decrease in numbers, the census for 1926 contains 2 bulls and 11 cows, which compares with 3 bulls, 5 cows and 10 heifers shown in 1924.

THE SOLVA HERD.

Owner: Captain J. H. Howell, Trewellwell, Solva, Pembrokeshire. There is no change in the numbers of this herd; the present figures are 28, consisting of 1 bull, 18 cows and heifers, and 9 heifer calves.

THE THEYDON HERD.

Owner: J. H. Silley, Theydon Grove, Epping. There is now only 1 heifer in this section.

THE WINKHURST HERD.

Owner: A. H. L. Bohrmann, Winkhurst Green, Ide Hill, near Sevenoaks.

There is an increase in the horned section of this herd.

In Volume IV. it numbered 14.

It now comprises 2 bulls, 5 cows, 10 heifers and 5 calves (2 bulls, 3 heifers), a total of 22.

POLLED HERDS.

THE BAWDESWELL HERD.

Owner: Major Q. E. Gurney, Bawdeswell Hall, Norfolk.

An increase is shown when the census, 46, composed of 2 bulls, 2 young bulls, 1 bull calf, 18 cows, 15 heifers, and 8 heifer calves, is compared with the total of 35 in Volume IV., namely, 2 bulls, 11 cows, 10 heifers and 12 calves.

THE BOLWICK HERD.

Owners: Walter Buxton and C. R. Birkbeck, Horstead House, Norwich.

The census shows a small increase, the present computation is 1 bull, 7 cows and 11 heifers: 19 altogether; whereas in Volume IV. it numbered 15.

THE FAYGATE HERD.

Owner: Sir Claud Alexander, Bart., Faygate Wood, Sussex. This section has been dispersed with the exception of 2 bulls.

THE GIFFORDS HERD.

Owner: Colonel J. C. Tabor, Gifford's Hall, Stoke-by-Nayland, Suffok.

This herd shows an increase; it contains 2 bulls and 17 cows, whereas in Volume IV. it consisted of 3 bulls and 8 cows.

THE HAUTBOIS HERD.

Owner: H. P. Wood, The Bungalow, Colkirk, Fakenham. This herd was founded by acquisitions from Bawdeswell.

THE HIGHAM HERD.

Owner: Mrs. R. L. Jobling, Higham Dykes, Newcastle-on-Tyne. At present there is one cow in this section.

THE HORSTEAD HERD.

Owner: Sir Roderick Wigan, Bart., Horstead Hall, Norwich. This herd was founded by the acquirement of 2 cows from Bawdeswell and Woodbastwick, and cattle from Hauthois.

THE KELMARSH HERD.

Owner: Captain C. G. Lancaster, Kelmarsh Hall, Northampton. The present figures exceed those of any previous year, making a total of 39, namely 2 bulls, 15 cows, 14 heifers, and 8 yearlings; this compares with a return of 27 in Volume IV.

THE RANWORTH HERD.

Owner: Captain H. J. Cator, M.C., Ranworth Hall, Ranworth, near Norwich.

This herd was founded by cattle from Woodbastwick; it consists of 2 bulls, 8 cows, 2 heifers and 4 heifer calves, making a total of 16.

THE ST. OSYTH HERD.

Owner: Brig.-Gen. K. Kincaid Smith, St. Osyth's Priory, Colchester.

A further rapid increase is to be recorded; the present total amounts to 41 head, namely, 3 bulls, 12 cows, 14 heifers and 12 calves.

In Volume IV. the census was 28, composed of 1 bull, 10 cows, 14 heifers and 3 calves.

THE SEDGEMERE HERD.



Constitution, Rules and Bye-Laws

OF THE

PARK CATTLE SOCIETY.

CONSTITUTION.

- 1. The name of the Society is the PARK CATTLE SOCIETY.
- 2. The Society shall consist of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and an unlimited number of Members, whose names and addresses shall be registered by the Secretary in a book kept for that purpose.
- 3. The entire control and management of the Society shall be vested in a Council, consisting of the President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and 12 elected members, six of whom shall retire annually and be eligible for re-election.

RULES.

- 1. The objects for which the Society is founded are :-
 - (a) To encourage the breeding of Park Cattle.
 - (b) To establish and publish a Herd Book for them.
 - (c) To obtain classes, to augment prizes at Shows, and to recommend judges thereat.
 - (d) To investigate cases of doubtful and suspected pedigrees.
 - (e) To settle disputes and questions relating to, or connected with, Park Cattle.
 - (f) To promote sales by auction or by private treaty of registered Park Cattle.
 - (g) To take any action legally incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, or any of them.
- 2. The election of Members shall be vested solely in the Council and shall be by ballot.

- 3. Any person favourable to the objects of the Society, and willing to conform to its rules shall be eligible for membership, but every candidate must be proposed in writing by a Member of the Society, and no person who has been expelled from any other breed Society shall be elected a member of the Park Cattle Society.
- 4. Any Member may withdraw from the Society on giving notice to the Secretary in writing, such retiring Member to have no claim whatever against the Society, and to be liable for his subscription for the current year in which such notice is given.
- 5. The annual subscription shall be one guinea, payable on election, and subsequently on the 1st of January in each year; but no Member whose subscription is in arrear shall be entitled to any privileges of the Society. Should any Member not have paid his subscription by the 30th April in any year, the Secretary shall send him notice by registered letter to pay the same, and should his subscription be still unpaid on December 31st in the same year, his name may be erased from the list of Members at the discretion of the Council.
- 6. Any Member violating the Rules of the Society shall be liable to be expelled by a vote of a majority of the Council, and any Member who shall, in the opinion of the Council, have been guilty or suspected of fraudulent practices in connection with live stock or live stock shows, or have acted in any way derogatory to the interests of the Society, or the breed, or who for any other reason shall be deemed by the Council to be an undesirable Member, shall be expelled.
- 7. Should a vacancy occur on the Council or among the officers, the Council shall fill such vacancy from among the Members of the Society. The Member so elected shall be deemed to represent the Member whose place he takes, and shall retire when that Member's term of office would have expired.

- 8. The Council may appoint Committees for any special purpose, and may delegate to them such of the powers of the Council as they may think necessary. The President and Vice-Presidents of the Society shall be ex-officio Members of all Committees.
- 9. A General Meeting of the Society shall be held not later than the week of the Royal Show in every year, at such time and place as the Council shall appoint, and 14 days' notice shall be given to every Member of the Society. At such Meeting a Report and Balance Sheet for the previous year shall be submitted, and the Officers and Council for the current year elected.

The said Annual Report and Balance Sheet, duly audited, shall be printed and circulated to the Members with the notice calling the Meeting.

- 10. The Council may at any time, and upon a requisition signed by not less than six Members of the Society (specifying the business for which such meeting is required) shall summon an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Society. At such extraordinary General Meeting no business may be transacted other than that for which such Meeting was specially summoned.
- 11. Every General Meeting shall have power to elect Honorary Members, to consider and vote on any report which the Council may present, and any resolution of which notice shall have been sent to every Member not less than 14 days previously. The voting at all General Meetings shall be by show of hands, and the Chairman shall have a casting vote.
- 12. The Council shall have power to deal with any matter which may arise and which is not provided for in these Rules.
- 13. In all these Rules the word "he" shall be deemed to include the word "she."

BYE-LAWS.

1. The Herd Book shall include particulars of the pedigree of Park Cattle eligible to be entered therein, and such other information as the Council or General Meeting may from time to time decide. The charge for entry in the Herd Book is 10s. for males and 5s. for females, and all fees must be paid at the time of entry.

No person who is not a Member of the Society will be allowed to register cattle in the Society's Herd Book.

Cattle not bred in Great Britain and Northern Ireland are excluded from entry in the Society's Herd Book.

- 2. Animals certified by the owners of any established Herd of Park Cattle to be without cross of any other breed will be accepted for entry in the Herd Book up to December 31st, 1918.
- 3. Up to a date to be decided by the Council, not earlier than December 31st, 1932, cattle of any age, which are partly of registered Park blood, may be entered in the Herd Book, on inspection, provided they are, in the opinion of the inspectors, of correct type. From that date the same privilege will, for a period only, be extended to those which have two or more crosses of a registered Park bull and/or cow, when such crosses have been entered in the Society's Grading-up Register.

At a later date only those whose sire and dam are both registered will be accepted for entry. This regulation does not apply to cattle obtained from the wild herds, which are eligible for entry at any time on production by the owner of a certificate of their origin from the breeder, or his representative.

4. Every herd must have a registered prefix, in addition to which each animal must be given a name, which cannot be altered after registration. The Council reserve the right to refuse any name or prefix without assigning a reason. A prefix must be registered when a Member first desires to make an entry in the Herd Book, and the charge will be one guinea.

Animals and herd-prefixes may be registered under plural ownership, providing not less than 2 partners in a partnership or 2 Directors of a Company are members and that no expelled member participates.

5. Any bull for which registration is desired and every cow calf must be registered before February 1st in the year following its birth, otherwise it will not be eligible for entry in the Herd Book.

This Rule does not apply to calves born in the wild herds.

6. The bona-fide owner of the cow at the time she calves shall be the breeder of the calf.

When a cow has been served by more than one bull the names of all must be given.

7. The transfer of any registered animal may be recorded on payment of a fee of 5s. No animal bred from a transferred bull or cow will be accepted for registration, unless the transfer of such bull or cow has been registered in the books of the Society.

The transfer of an entire herd with prefix may be registered on payment of a fee of 3 guineas; except when transferee is an heir of a retiring or deceased member, when the fee shall be one guinea.

Show Rules and STANDARD

(Coloration and Conformation)

GOVERNING THE

Description Exhibition, Inspection, and Judging

PARK CATTLE.

CONDITION OF EXHIBITS, &c.

- S 1.—No cattle are eligible to be exhibited as "PARK" unless registered, or entered and accepted for registration, in the Park Cattle Society's Herd Book.
- S 2.—Park cattle must be entered for exhibition under their registered name with Herd Book reference, and the Exhibitor must be the owner and shall be responsible for the identification and description of exhibits.
- S 3.—Dehorned cattle are not eligible to be exhibited as "polled," and cattle with "snags" ("scurs") or "rudimentary horns" are not eligible to be exhibited as "horned."
- N.B.—(i) "Snags" ("scurs") are horny substances on skin in the positions of the horns of horned cattle. These are also known as "slugs."
 (ii) "Rudimentary horns" are horn-core substances on skull in the positions of the horns of horned cattle. These are also known as "abortive horns."

- \$ 4.—Park cattle are not eligible to be exhibited as, or presumably intended to be, Breeding Stock when (a) deformed, (b) sterilized, (c) a hermaphrodite, (d) having defective, deformed, or ruptured genitals, (e) a bull over 30 months old that is not the sire of living progeny, (f) a female of unproved fertility that is twin to a bull, (g) a female over 30 months old that is neither in-calf nor in-milk, (h) a female in-milk but not in-calf eight months after last calving.
- S 5.—Park cattle whose coloration has in any way been "faked" (i.e., artificially altered from natural state), and/or who are in any way exhibited in a fraudulent condition, shall be disqualified, and the judge shall notify the Council of the Park Cattle Society of the fact of such disqualification.
- S 6.—Park Bulls are not eligible for exhibition in "Park Cattle" (breeding stock) Classes unless they have the generally-recognised "Park" markings, viz.: a combination of dark muzzle, ears, pupil of eyes, and fore-fetlock "points" in their coloration. (For minimum marking, see Diagram 3.)

MARKS TO BE AWARDED FOR PRIZES.

S 7.—To individual animals shall be awarded (according to merit) any number of marks up to 50 for Coloration;
and 50 for Conformation.

"MILK" AND "UDDER CAPACITY" MARKS.

- S 8.-In addition to the above, marks shall be awarded for :-
 - (a) The "MILK" in the breeding of BULLS (any age) and HEIFERS (maiden or uncalved):—
 - 5 marks: when dam has been entered in the "Register of Dairy Cattle" of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.
 - 10 marks: when the dam and sire's dam have been entered in the "Register of Dairy Cattle" of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(b) The "UDDER CAPACITY" of COWS: which shall be tested by one milking, to be made at time of judging, in judging ring, or at such place as the judge may direct (where the milk shall be weighed):—

1 mark for every 1 lb. of milk from

Cows under 3 years old, after deducting the first 7 lbs. of milk yielded.

Cows under 4 years old, after deducting the first 14 lbs. of milk yielded.

Cows over 4 years old, after deducting the first 21 lbs.

Cows over 4 years old, after deducting the first 21 los. of milk yielded.

- (Note.—The Committee of the Park Cattle Society responsible for Show arrangements may provide for other forms of milking-tests (or trials) in lieu of "Udder-Capacity" tests, or may eliminate any such form of milking test for cows, as the circumstances of the occasion may warrant; but any such deviation from Rule S 8 shall be communicated to exhibitors at time of soliciting show entries, or not less than three weeks prior to the date of Show).
- S 9.-No cow with an "overstocked" udder (i.e., with milk in udder in excess of dry-carrying capacity) is eligible to be judged or milked for "udder capacity" or any other milking test. Cows must be able to walk and stand without losing milk. Cows not complying with this condition shall be so partly milked (to rectify the defect) as the judge may direct prior to any "udder-capacity" or other milking test. (Failure to comply with this condition shall disqualify a cow from an award of Marks under Rule S 8.)

JUDGING PROCEDURE AND AWARD OF MARKS.

S 10.—When exhibited Park Cattle are judged for the award of marks (for prizes), they shall first be judged for Coloration, and have 50 or any less number of marks awarded according to individual merit. They shall then be judged for Conformation and have 50 or any less number of marks awarded according to merit. Their "milk" or "udder capacity" marks (if any) shall then be ascertained. The animals shall be "placed" and prized according to their individual highest total number of marks gained.

JUDGING NOTE.

As the Coloration of Park Cattle includes so many minor variations, it has been necessary to extend the Standard beyond the limits usual with such delineations.

The "perfect" (or "ideal") coloration aimed at is noted in Rule S 11, and the generally recognised "Park" marking is the combination (irrespective of other markings) of "points" rendering bulls eligible for exhibition under Rule S 6.
